**In re: Wood County Probate Court Orders
As To Marriage Licenses Arising From the Covid-19
(Coronavirus) Public Health Emergency
and State of Emergency in the United States
and State of Ohio**

By order filed May 14, 2020, this court issued certain temporary orders relative to the issuance of marriage licenses in the Wood County Probate Court. Given the current directives from the State of Ohio and recommendations from the Center for Disease Control, the court issues the following orders at this time.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND ORDERED effective June 2, 2021, this court's May 14, 2020 orders relative to the issuance of marriage licenses in the Wood County Probate Court are vacated unless specifically referenced herein.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED the following orders relative to the issuance of marriage licenses are effective June 2, 2021 and shall remain in place until further order:

1. Applicants should continue to call Probate Court at 419-354-9230 to make an appointment to begin the application process.
2. After scheduling an appointment, applicants are encouraged to complete the online application found under the Marriage License tab on the Probate Court website (probatecourt.co.wood.oh.us). Upon completion of the online application, a tracking number will be generated on the screen.
3. Please e-mail the tracking number with your names and appointment date to probatecourt@woodcountyohio.gov.
4. Certain documentation is required to obtain a marriage license which includes proof of identity (driver's license, passport or birth certificate), proof of address if current residence is not shown on your ID, and, if previously divorced, a copy of your most recent decree of divorce or dissolution. You may e-mail this to the court with your online tracking number, or present it when you personally appear on your appointment date to complete the application process.
5. If you are unable to provide the required documentation electronically, you must present it to the clerk at the time of application.
6. This order shall remain in full force and effect until such time as it is modified or rescinded.
